FIFTY IN FIFTY CAMPAIGN

WE CAN IF WE WILL

There is an old Negro Spiritual that states, "If I could I surely would stand on the rock where Moses stood." Since the song referred to the accomplishments of Moses as a result of faith, a theologian in making a constructive criticism of the song said, "It should read, If I would I surely could stand on the rock where Moses stood." Last Sunday thirty five more of our people made commitments either through cash contributions or by signing pledges for the Fifty in Fifty Campaign. The commitments of these thirty-five amounted to \$2,357.25. This, added to that which had already been made brings the grand total to \$33,205.25. There still remains \$16,794.75 to be raised by the other 865 members of our church. If only those of this number would act NOW and would either give or pledge to give their best to this program between now and December 31, 1950, we could be successful in underwriting the New Building Program by the time our Pastor returns. It is not, "can we" but "WILL WE" be Victorious in this challenging undertaking.
