LIBERTY OF CONSCIENCE

E. Y. Mullin said in his book, *Baptist Beliefs*:

"A free church is a free state is a New Testament principle which has found full expression only in modern times and in the Western hemisphere.

"The great principle underlying religious liberty is this: God alone is Lord of the conscience. To him men must give account and only to him. The principle which corresponds with this on the side of the state is that civil magistrates are ordained of God.

"For its own ends the state is sovereign. But those ends do not include the religious life of the individual at all. Hence the civil and religious life of man belongs to different spheres entirely. The right of every soul to direct access to God is an inalienable right, with which the state must not interfere."

The Bible says:

"Let every soul be subject unto the higher powers. For there is no power but of God: the powers that be are ordained of God" (Romans 13:1).

"Render therefore unto Caesar the things which are Caesar's; and unto God the things that are God's" (Matthew 22:21).

"Then Peter and the other apostles answered and said, We ought to obey God rather than men" (Acts 5:29).

"And fear not them which kill the body, but are not able to kill the soul: but rather fear him which is able to destroy both soul and body in hell (Mathews 10:28).

"Neither be ye called masters: for one is your Master, even Christ" (Matthew 23:10).
