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SUNDAY SCHOOL ADOPTS STANDARD AS GOAL AND PROGRAM OF WORK FOR THE NEW YEAR

On the recommendation of the Superintendents Cabinet, our Sunday School on Wednesday evening adopted the Standard of Excellence as our program of work and goal for the new year. We qualify as a Standard Sunday School on all but two points. These are:

II. ENLARGEMENT

2. Fifty per cent of the officers and teachers including the pastor or superintendent, shall hold an award for either BUILDING A STANDARD SUNDAY SCHOOL or A CHURCH USING ITS SUNDAY SCHOOL.

3. Fifty per cent of the officers and teachers, including the pastor or superintendent, shall hold an award for one of the other books in the Sunday School Training Course.

How to Test Amusements

The Bible says nothing directly against some of the modern forms of amusements. But it does lay down some excellent principles by which a Christian can be guided.

1. Does the pleasure in question tend to enslave me? (1 Corinthians 6:12).
2. Does it help in building up my body, my mind, my heart? (1 Corinthians 10:23).
3. Does it cause others to stumble over me? (1 Corinthians 8:12, 13).
4. Can it be engaged in to the glory of God? (1 Corinthians 10:31).

5. If I am not sure as to the answer that must be given to the above four questions, and if still in doubt, I will take the safe side and give God the benefit of the doubt (Romans 14:23).

What Can I Do?

"What can I do for my church?" exclaimed a young man to his minister.

"Well, you can manage to mention it in your conversation once each day, and in your silent prayers at night.

"You can attend its services, loyally support at least one of its organizations, pay some amount willingly into its treasury weekly, be a reader of one of its representative periodicals, qualify yourself to explain its leading doctrines, be 'out and out' in your loyalty to it, invite the unchurched and unsaved to its services (very important) and exhibit a hearty cordiality at its services.

"The busiest Christian in the world can find time to do the above without at all neglecting anything on earth, and he will be happier, wiser, and more satisfied for the effort he has put forth.

"Test it."

How Are You Doing?

- Do those in my home and nearest me daily respect my Christianity?
- Do I each Wednesday refresh my soul and mind in the "Hour of Power"?
- Have I found some job in the church in which I find joy?
- Do I gladly give one-tenth and more of my income to God through my church?
- Do I really love Jesus Christ, and delight to see others love him?
- Is Christ first on my calendar?

Grade yourself—7 points for each "yes." Possible 91 points. Anything less constitutes "falling short." Work on each point daily, especially the "no" items. Put this in your Bible.
