## BAPTISTS BEGIN ENLARGED ASSOCIATIONAL PROGRAM

The 36 churches of the Pensacola Bay Baptist Association are launching out in a vigorous program of Kingdom building. We rejoice in the coming of Brother McCoy Bynum to be our Secretary of Promotion and Missions. He has had excellent training and experience for this new position of leadership. A graduate of Southwestern Baptist Theological Seminary and a chaplain during the last war, he comes to us from a successful pastorate in San Antonio, Texas.

The office for the Pensacola Bay Baptist Association will be opened this next week in the Pollack annex of our church.

The enlarged program of the association will include: (1) the location and establishment of mission stations and new churches, (2) strengthening the rural work in Escambia County, (3) additional promotion of all denominational programs and agencies, and (4) the development of a sense of Christian oneness in the propagation of the Gospel through our Baptist churches.

First Baptist Church welcomes Brother Bynum and his family to this new field. We have indicated our willingness to support the program in a financial way. Now let us be faithful in prayer for and service to the splendid program of our association.

## PROGRESS TOWARD OUR REVIVAL

The next step in preparation for our revival is census taking on next Sunday, February 11. To preach to lost people during our revival requires that we find these lost people. Did you ever go hunting? It was not much of a job to get the game if you could find it. True as can be it is: Find the lost people and you are far on the way toward winning them! But finding always comes before winning.

Proof of the statement is that each year Southern Baptist churches win one out of three of the lost people enrolled in their Sunday Schools. Each year Southern Baptist churches win one out of 240 of the lost people who are not enrolled in Sunday School. How then can a church locate all the lost people in a community?

Dr. C. E. Matthews says: "The census, followed by visitation and personal work, is what made the difference in the number of baptisms in the churches west of the Mississippi River during the simultaneous revival effort April 9-23, 1950. Wherever churches took a census and followed it up by personal visitation the number of souls saved was nearly doubled."

Thousands of other pastors join Dr. Matthews in his evaluation of a census and its contribution to evangelism.

Our deacons will serve as team captains. Perhaps one of them has contacted you and asked you to serve with him on his team.

83 have volunteered to help, a minimum of 67 more are needed. Call the church office if you will help.

The Bible teaches much about the Christian workers watering, sowing, and the like. God gives the increase. There is no other way. But the Bible teaches that he who sows bountifully shall reap also bountifully. Let us sow now that there may be an abundant spiritual harvest during the days of our revival.
