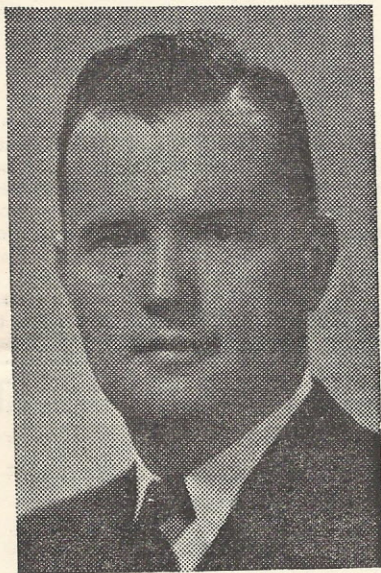

A MESSAGE FROM DR. MARNEY

The very thought of 18,000 churches in one revival campaign is thrilling. What a day if all can experience revival. As for me, my thoughts, prayers, and responsibilities are for and to the church in Pensacola. If all others are graciously used and we are not it would be sad indeed. I am honored by your invitation. 1951 CRUSADE

One year ago Southern Baptists conducted a two weeks' revival crusade in churches west of the Mississippi River. Of the 8,500 churches in the area with a membership of more than 2,250,000, perhaps 6,000 cooperated. Later this month, March 25 - April 8, we are to have a similar campaign in the East.

The reason for our attempting a simultaneous crusade is obvious to all who take note of the great power movements in the world today.

Power today is on the side of concerted effort, whether in politics, labor, industry, or religion.

Working together, all the churches are supporting the same mission causes in the same way. It is a good method.

We are not attempting the same method in the field of evangelism. This is one reason for the simultaneous crusade.

The other reason is that Satan never gripped human life as he does today. This is the best age for Satan since Lucifer rebelled against God in Heaven. So tremendous is Satan's power and his scheme of operation that the world is now in danger of losing all that the Christians hold dear.

Nothing but an all-out concerted effort on the part of Christian people who believe alike will suffice in this war against Satan.
