

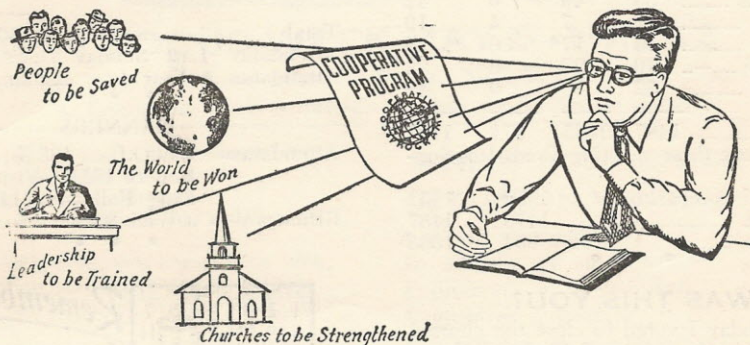

THE DEVIL DOESN'T CARE

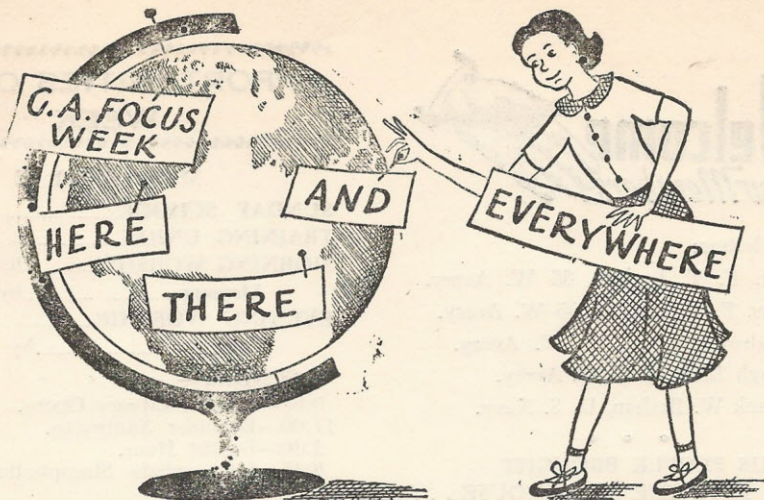
