ARMED FORCES SUNDAY TO BE OBSERVED

At the 11 o'clock hour on Sunday, we shall be privileged to have as our guest preacher, Chaplain Robert Schwyhart who has recently come to Pensacola as Senior Chaplain at the Naval Air Station. Chaplain Schwyhart is a Baptist and a graduate of the Southern Baptist Theological Seminary. He holds the rank of Commander.

Since the time of his appointment as chaplain in 1937, Chaplain Schwyhart has had a very colorful Navy career. In 1942 while chaplain of the USS Vincennes, he participated in the Battle of Midway and later in the Battle of Savo Island. In 1944 he participated in the occupation of Guam.

At the outbreak of the Korean War he was Division Chaplain of the First Marine Division. He participated in operations at Inchon, Seoul, Sensun, Hamhung and the Korean Central Front through November 2, 1950. He was awarded the Bronze Star Medal for his courage and devotion to duty in the Korean conflict.

Our pastor will preach in the 8:30 a.m. and 8:00 p.m. worship services.

HOSPITAL CAMPAIGN LAUNCHED

The drive to "finish the job" so that the Baptist Hospital and the Crippled Children's Home may begin operations without indebtedness gained momentum in a most enthusiastic meeting in our church on Tuesday evening.

Mr. Earl Gaston was the principal speaker in this "kick-off" meeting. He discussed the history of the hospital movement which is deeply rooted in the life of this church. "Now that the hospital is almost a realization," said Mr. Gaston, "we have an opportunity to keep \$168,000 in Pensacola which would otherwise be paid in interest on the \$325,000 indebtedness." He challenged us to "lift our sights and finish the job."

The chairman of the Baptist phase of the campaign, Mr. Theron Guthrie, outlined the program of solicitation which is being promoted throughout this section of Florida. He presented the leaders for our local campaign who in turn introduced their captains and team members. Miss Sarah Andress is leader of the women's division and Dr. Wallace Mayo is the men's division leader.

There were eighty-five people present. The first report meeting of progress in the general solicitation will be on next Tuesday evening from 6:30 to 7:00.
