



A DREAM THAT'S HERE TO STAY

A well-nigh forgotten popular song of a few years ago asked the question, "Did you ever see a dream walking?" and answered "Well, I did."

I want to ask you if you ever saw a dream rising, standing, ready to serve, protected for the future, yet needing your support to make its help effective? Well, I did — and you should see it too.

Almost a decade ago some earnest Baptists, recognizing the important place of healing in the complete ministry of Jesus and his followers, dreamed a dream of another hospital to help relieve sickness and suffering in this area. Everyone knew such a facility was needed. With some the image of the dream was fleeting. Others dared to hope for it. To those who worked faithfully and gave liberally toward realization of the dream, the difficulties encountered at times made it almost a nightmare, but they refused to stop dreaming.

Less than two years ago we saw that dream begin to rise from below ground level toward its expected height. And now at long last I see it standing, a dream in concrete and steel, in brick and tile in wood and glass, in chrome and aluminum,—a dream in laboratory and kitchen, in power plant and laundry, in operating rooms and X-ray equipment, in patient's rooms and sun porches — and all the other myriad things it takes to make up a modern house of healing—a dream standing,—a dream that's here to stay. You must see it, too!

Standing completed and ready to serve, built and furnished and to be operated at today's tremendous costs, the hospital can have no favored groups or special rates, either to Baptists or to any others who are able to pay. There is being worked out a splendid plan by which churches can arrange for treatment of patients who cannot afford to pay for hospital care. This plan will provide some reasonable discounts and other advantages.

This now very tangible dream, which you may view in detail on October 6th or 7th before it goes into actual operation is protected for future Christian service. Owned by a locally chartered non-profit corporation, the members of which corporation must be members of Baptist churches in this area, and a majority of whose directors must also be Baptists, the hospital will always be under Christian control and direction. Of course it is set to serve suffering humanity of all creeds or none.

It is well to remember, too, that while the Baptist Hospital Corporation is composed of individual Baptist citizens, the hospital is neither owned nor is it to be operated by any Baptist church or churches, association or convention. All have contributed freely toward the building of the institution simply in the interest of healing in the spirit and in the name of Christ.
