

# TEN THOUGHTS ON TITHING

1. THE TENDENCY OF IT: Our generation is returning to the practice of the early Christians. Multitudes now tithe, and they find it a precious and profitable practice.
2. THE TRUTH OF IT: Tithing was practiced by Abraham, promised by Jacob, preached by the prophets, preserved by Jesus, promulgated by the apostles, and prescribed for all God's people.
3. THE TEACHABLENESS OF IT: Any child old enough to be a Christian can compute one tenth of his income.
4. THE TRUST OF IT: God has entrusted us with all that we possess. Christian sincerity should compel us to give the tenth back to Him.
5. THE TESTIMONY OF IT: The world will not long doubt the profession of the one who consistently tithes his income because he loves the Lord.
6. THE THANKFULNESS OF IT: Rendering the tithe unto God is the concrete illustration of gratitude to Him for all His benefits unto man.
7. THE TRANSCENDENCY OF IT: Tithing transcends or reaches above mere profession of love for Him. It meets the acid test and proves allegiance to the Kingdom of God.
8. THE THRIFT OF IT: He who learns to tithe his income also learns how to save a similar amount for himself and family.
9. THE TREASURY OF IT: Israel was commanded to bring the tithe into the storehouse which was a part of the temple. The modern storehouse is the church. All Scriptural tithes must be brought into the church.
10. THE TEXT OF IT: Malachi 3:10 says: "Bring ye all the tithes into the storehouse, that there may be meat in mine house, and prove me now herewith, saith the Lord of Hosts, if I will not open you the windows of Heaven, and pour you out a blessing, that there shall not be room enough to receive it."
