SUNDAY IS LOYALTY FOLLOW-UP DAY

We have made an excellent beginning in our Stewardship Campaign for 1952. Your committee wishes to express appreciation to all who responded so magnificently on the opening Sunday. We are convinced that there are many other members and friends who will return their signed covenant cards, either by mail or in person by this coming Sunday. We are, therefore, suggesting that Sunday be made LOYALTY DAY FOLLOW-UP in all of the services. Then, on the following Sunday (December 2), our large and enthusiastic committee will begin the every member canvass of those who have not responded up to that time. This will be a canvass to acquaint the membership with the program of the church, to discover opportunities for Christian service which we may be neglecting at this time, and to challenge each member to accept his individual responsibility to Christ and His Church.

691 signed covenant cards were presented to the church this past week. We rejoice in the returns which indicate that most of the people represented in these commitments will be faithful in private, family and public worship in 1952. It is wonderful to know that 538 members have covenanted to endeavor to win at least one person to Christ next year. Too, 412 have already indicated their purpose to tithe their income next year. Indeed we do rejoice in these spiritual commitments.

Equally encouraging and significant has been the response to the proposed financial objectives of our church for 1952. The total amount pledged on 691 cards is \$78,464. Our financial secretary states that a large number of our people have increased their program of giving to the church of which they are a part. Surely with the loyal support of the hundreds yet to make their commitments, 1952 has the promise of being the greatest year in the long and glorious history of First Baptist Church. Let us pray definitely, earnestly and persistently for a glorious victory in this as in every worthy undertaking for our Lord.
