Organized in 1939, the Glee Club rapidly distinguished itself among southwestern musical organizations. The popularity of the group has drawn talent from the entire nation. From October 18 to January 10, 1952, the chorus presented a thirteen weeks series of weekly radio programs over the nationwide Liberty Broadcasting system. (Note: The Glee Club will present a 30 minute broadcast over our local radio station WCOA Sunday afternoon at 5:30.)
