The "Six Successive Sundays in Sunday School" attendance campaign has been planned to reach its climax on Sunday, March 29, which will be the closing Sunday of our Revival Meeting, and Sunday, April 5, which will be Easter. This "Spring Offensive" has as its purpose the enlistment of many new people and the increased regularity in attendance of our absentees. Sunday, March 29, will have two main emphases. Of course, our attempt to break all attendance records on that day will be one. Evangelism will be the other. Our hope and prayer is that the attendance campaign will bring into our evangelistic services that day many unsaved and unaffiliated Baptists. The campaign, then, would close the following Sunday, Easter.
