THE SURVEY BULLETIN

Dr. E. D. Head, president of Southwestern Baptist Theological Seminary since 1942, has resigned, effective August 1, due to ill health. Enrollment has increased from 636 in 1942 to 2,160 for the current year.

The Foreign Mission Board in its March meeting appropriated \$790,527.01 for buildings and equipment for its foreign mission fields; and named three young people for overseas mission service.

First Church, Tulsa, Oklahoma, dedicated its new million dollar educational building March 15. On that Sunday they had 1900 in Sunday School. Dr. T. L. Holcomb was the principal speaker at the dedication service.

"Red" Barber, popular CBS sports announcer and commentator and an outstanding layman of the Episcopal Church, has been named national radio chairman of National Sunday School Week, April 13-19.

A 12,000-seat portable "tin can" tabernacle is being built for the Billy Graham campaign in Detroit next fall. The all-aluminum tabernacle will be fabricated by R. G. LeTourneau and will be used in three England campaigns after the Detroit meeting.

Ninety per cent of the white babies in the United States are born in hospitals, and 98 per cent are attended by a physician; while 70 per cent of Negro babies are born without a doctor's care.

The American Automobile Association predicts that 66 million persons will climb in 22 million cars in 1953 and set out to see the sights. Each car will travel an average of 1,200 miles on a vacation of eleven days, and each of the three occupants will go home minus \$140.
