The average attendance for the S-6 Campaign is 1201. This is 12 per Sunday School during the campaign and 552 visitors. A new attendance record was set. SURVEY BULLETIN

Dr. Louie D. Newton, pastor of the Druid Hills Baptist Church, Atlanta, has been named the nation's outstanding minister in 1952 by *Church Management*, a publication dealing with achievements and personalities in American religious circles.

Dr. Duke K. McCall, president of Southern Baptist Theological Seminary, leaves this week for Korea on a preaching mission arranged by the secretary of the Air Force. He and representatives of the Catholic and Jewish faiths will accompany chiefs of chaplains of the Air Force, Army and Navy.

The Baptist Bible Institute, located at Lakeland, Florida, will move to a new location at Graceville, Florida. The school will be built on 160 acres just outside the city. Dr. Arthur H. Stainback is the new president.

Fourteen Southern Baptist churches last year baptized more than 200 each; six baptized more than 300; and three baptized more than 400. Total baptisms during the past six years exceeded two million, a record in Southern Baptist evangelism.

Church services are being broadcast directly to UN fighting men in frontline trenches each Sunday under a new program instituted by the farthest forward station of the United States Armed Forces Network in Korea. The first service was conducted by Chaplain Paul A. Winslow of Arlington, Virginia, who spoke on "The Wonder of the Word."

According to a January survey of all denominations made by the Evangelical Foreign Missions Association, there is only one missionary to every 21,000 population in Africa; one to 43,000 in Latin America; one to 70,000 in Japan; one to 96,000 in the Near East; one to 130,000 in India and Pakistan; and one to every 150,000 in Southeast Asia.


