## ARE YOU KEEPING UP?

Are you up to date in presenting your tithes and offerings to the church? The excellent record which we have had thus far in this budget year has been made possible by the larger stewardship of a larger number of people. Many of our people are tithing. Others have increased their gifts to the Lord's work. Because of the systematic and liberal giving of a large number of our people we were able to exceed our budget needs during the first four months of this year.

### THE SURVEY BULLETIN

A. Warren Huyck, pastor of First Church, Augusta, Georgia, for almost nine years, has accepted the pastorate of the First Church, West Palm Beach, Florida. He succeeds R. Kelly White, now president of Belmont Baptist College, Nashville.

As Israel completed her fifth year on April 19, it was announced that 12.6 per cent of all the Jews in the world now live there. There are now 11,672,000 Jews distributed among 97 countries of the world. About 5,000,000 live in the United States.

The staggering need of the Christian message throughout the world is evidenced by the fact that there are approximately a million more Mohammedans, Buddhists, and Confucianists in the world than Christians.

Methodist leaders, in a meeting of their Board of Evangelism, have set a goal of 350,000 new church members for the rest of the year. More than 5,000 churches are now in simultaneous campaigns which conclude May 10.

According to a report of American Business Men's Research Foundation, 2,068 weekly papers excluded liquor advertising from their pages last year. This was an increase of 317 papers taking a similar stand in 1950. In addition, 85 consumer magazines and 143 farm and home magazines excluded such advertising also.

A Wall Street Journal survey has revealed that used houses in most price brackets have dropped from 5 per cent to 15 per cent in prices over a year ago. New York and Los Angeles are exceptions.

According to the latest Macfadden survey, as of January 1, 1953, 49.3 per cent of the families of the United States earn \$3,000 or more, and 18.1 per cent earn \$5,000 or over. 26.8 per cent earn under \$2,000.

The Department of Commerce reported last week that Americans owe \$82 billion on mortgages, installment purchases, and other short-term debts, compared with \$24 billion at the close of World War II.
