## THE SURVEY BULLETIN

In 1952 there were 6,127 "Four Star Churches," or churches that have a Sunday School, Training Union, W. M. U., and Brotherhood. Of this number, 1,234 were in open country churches. Texas led, with Georgia, Louisiana, Missouri, Oklahoma and Mississippi following in that order. Louisiana led in the number in open country churches.

Fourteen churches in the Southern Baptist Convention baptized more than 200 persons each in 1952. Six baptized more than 300 and three baptized more than 400.

New church construction started in June amounted to \$38,000,000, according to the Department of Commerce. This was a 23 per cent gain over June, 1952, and brought the total value of new buildings started this year to \$208 million, compared with \$178 million in the first half of 1952. The all-time high in church construction, \$452 million, set in 1951 may be equalled this year.

President Eisenhower and his Cabinet signed the "Declaration of Freedom," sponsored by the National Association of Evangelicals, at a ceremony at the White House recently. The document pledges Americans to cherish and exemplify the seven freedoms found in the 23rd Psalm. The sponsors of the campaign will endeavor to get 1,000,000 signatures by July 4, 1954.

The President has signed legislation which for the first time in American history recognizes civilian service performed by conscientious objectors as being "constructive service" equal to military duty.

Pilots of new, faster fighter-planes have encountered new thrills in altitude flying. In addition to the buffeting experienced when their planes penetrate the sonic barrier, they have recently discovered a jet-stream, an aerial river that races sheet-thin around the world at speed up to 300 miles an hour at an altitude of around 43,000 feet. A pilot recently flew into the jet-stream and cruised at 650 miles an hour without using the maximum engine output.

The Government of India has issued a number of regulations aimed at eliminating liquor from public life. There is to be no alcoholic drink at state functions; no liquor advertising accepted in India-owned newspapers; elimination of all drinking scenes from motion pictures, and diplomatic representatives abroad are to substitute fruit juices for cocktails at all official functions.
