## THE SURVEY BULLETIN

(Continued from Page Three)

Eighteen hundred young people from 29 nations attended the fourth Baptist Youth World Conference meeting at Rio de Janeiro. Speakers included youth leaders from many nations. Robert S. Denny, Nashville, chairman of the Youth Committee of the Baptist World Alliance, brought the keynote address.

In 1949, 29.7 per cent of our national budget was spent for military services. In 1954, the percentage will be increased to 59.0 per cent, or \$46.3 billion. Of this amount, \$17.4 billion will be spent in the procurement of military equipment . . . The \$46.3 billion is more than 35 times as much as the total contributions of all denominations to all causes in the United States in 1952, and 184 times as much as these denominations gave to all missions and benevolences.
