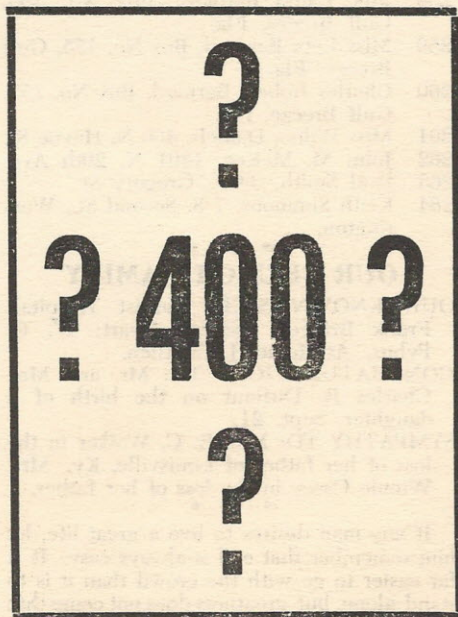


KNOW OUR WORKERS
