THE SURVEY BULLETIN

In December forty-three official representatives of state convention boards, the W. M. U. of the Southern Baptist Convention, and Southern Baptist agencies, voted unanimously to create co-operatively a Southern Baptist Encyclopedia; elected Norman W. Cox to be the managing editor; and provided an editorial committee to prepare a blue print and specifications of the proposed project. Dr. C. W. Pope was elected chairman of the general committee and Dr. Orin Cornett, secretary.

Baptist history was in the making January 8 when Southern Baptists in Ohio met in the Westside Baptist Church and organized the State Convention of Baptists in Ohio, affiliating with the Southern Baptist Convention. They organized with forty churches and approximately 8,000 members. Rev. Jehn Kirtz of Dayton was elected its first Moderator. Out-of-state speakers included Porter South of the Executive Committee; Courts Redford and S. F. Dowis of the Home Mission Board; W. C. Boone, Kentucky General Association; and J. P. Edmunds, Baptist Sunday School Board. Ray Roberts, Dayton, is its Executive Secretary.

Our Budget—It was understood by the church, of course, that our budget goal includes \$1,000 per Sunday through the regular budget for the Building Fund. Since this was not stated in the January 1st **Builder** it is well to remind you at this time that our local and missionary budget comes to \$83,000 which, plus the \$52,000 Building Budget, makes a grand total budget of \$135,400.

Our Task—Already I am beginning to see some of the things at which we must work together. I was not satisfied last Sunday when we had no additions to the church, or professions of faith. Were you? If we will do our part, we can count upon God to do His.

Do not misunderstand! I am not in the least discouraged. I just want to be sure that we do our part.

WCOA—In addition to being on the air at 11 o'clock each Sunday in February, the Pastor is to lead the devotional period over WCOA at 9:15 a.m. each Saturday in February. Tell our sick and shut-in friends.

The Record—January is past and the record written. We averaged 1049 in Sunday School and 290 in Training Union. There were 20 additions to the church, four by baptism. Our total gifts and designations came to \$16,104.66.

Congratulations—To the Senior Department of our Sunday School. According to last Sunday's record they had 31 members and one visitor present, and there were 32 of them at the morning worship services. Your department can't beat that.

Did You Notice—According to the local press the number of criminal cases handled in the County Court last year was almost double the 1952 record, 2,616 compared to 1,352. Then some folks are satisfied to neglect the Lord's House on Sunday!

Scouts—Sunday night recognition is going to be given to our Boy Scouts and their work. This is their Anniversary Week.
