## THE TERM OF DEACONS

From time to time there has been discussion in the meetings of the deacons concerning the plan of rotation to be followed in the terms of service by the deacons. Others in the church have likewise discussed the matter. It is quite evident that our members do not all think exactly alike. In this, as in all other questions in the life of the church, we want to follow the will of the majority of our members after all of us have prayerfully sought divine leadership.

Those who favor the possibility of immediate re-election feel that experienced men should not be lost to active service.

Those who favor the elapse of a year before re-election feel that new men will more likely be selected as deacons from time to time under this plan, and that the retirement of a deacon from active service can take place with ease.

The best time to seek the will of the church in a question of this kind is at a time when there is no issue before the church and when no personalities are involved. Within the near future, the church will be asked to express its desire. The ballot will read as follows:

### DEACONS

(Check one of the statements—the one which you favor)

- 1. When a deacon's term of active service expires I prefer that he be eligible for immediate re-election by the church.
- 2. When a deacon's term of active service expires I prefer that he be eligible for re-election by the church only after at least a year has elapsed.

Please report the deposit to the church office. We will make an effort to keep a credit level of 10 pints at all times. Withdrawals can be made only with the approval of two of the following: Mr. Pat Groner, Mrs. G. T. Sutton, the Pastor. The handling charges will be borne by those who receive the benefit of this service. A list of those who make donations will be carried in **The Builder** from time to time.

The whole plan has been designed to enable our church to render a better ministry in the name of Christ.

## KNOW OUR WORKERS



MRS. JOHN F. BUSEY

Mrs. John F. Busey, 1001 E. Strong St., was born at Tunnel Springs, Alabama on August 13, 1903. She was converted in 1916 at the Tunnel Springs Church under the pastorate of Rev. S. Lindsey. She came in this church from the Tunnel Springs Church in 1925 when Dr. Rousseau was pastor.

At Tunnel Springs she was a Sunday School teacher, Sunbeam and G. A. Leader and Training Union officer. Since she has been in Pensacola, she has served as a teacher in the Primary Department, Circle Chairman, Training Union General Secretary. At the present time she is Department Secretary for Adult 3 Sunday School, First Vice-President of the W.M.U. and General Bible Readers' Leader in the Training Union. Mrs. Busey also holds offices in the Association and State Baptist work—she is President of Pensacola Bay Baptist Association and has been on the State Mission Board for three years.

Mr. and Mrs. Busey were married on June 2, 1925. Their children are Ruth, who is at home, Vivian Ladner and June Brady.

Baker James Cauthen, executive secretary of the Foreign Mission Board, announced at the March meeting of the Board that the missionary staff increased from 625 in 1943 to 908 in 1954; 464 new appointments during this period; and an objective of 1,750 missionaries. Lottie Moon Offering to date (March 11) was \$3,371,000, \$90,000 more than last year, with money yet coming in. Nine new missionaries were appointed for Southern Rhodesia, Nigeria, Japan and Mexico.—The Survey Bulletin.
