 3. Pack your Bible and quarterlies—keep up daily family worship.
- II. DON'T ROB GOD TO PAY FOR YOUR VACATION
 1. Bring your tithes and offerings to the church **before you leave**.
 2. Or, mail your gifts back each week.
- III. SECURE YOUR OWN REPLACEMENT
 1. Whatever your job in the church, find someone to take your place **before you leave**.
 2. Be sure your replacement understands exactly what to do—and when.
 3. No office should be left vacant while you are on vacation.
- IV. WRITE TO YOUR CHURCH
 1. Every Monday, mail the bulletins or other material collected on Sunday back to your pastor. Make notes on the good things you see.
 2. Include a personal word to the folks at prayer meeting.
- V. COME BACK TO YOUR CHURCH AS SOON AS YOU GET HOME
 1. Don't miss a service—you are needed.
 2. Have a word to say in class, union, circle or prayer meeting about your fellowship with other Christians while on vacation.
- VI. WHY ALL THIS?
 1. Because you are Christ's and you want to be loyal to Him—all the time.
 2. Because your soul needs **re-creation** as well as your body and mind.
 3. Because you do not want any "slump" in your church.
 4. Because God does not take a vacation from you.
