

**Missions**—Speaking of missions, Dr. Mary I. Griffith, of Winston-Salem, N. C., is giving her services through out Foreign Mission Board, August 2-9, assisting at the Ire Welfare Center, Nigeria, West Africa. This fine Christian doctor is offering herself at no expense to the Foreign Mission Board. She is due back in Winston-Salem, August 13. I like that kind of missionary effort upon the part of a Christian doctor.

**Correction:** The transposition of a 3 and a 4 gave you an incorrect report on our Building Fund last week. When I saw the printed bulletin I knew that something was wrong. Instead of \$264,443.00, the figure should have been \$263,444. Figures, as well as people, are found in the wrong place sometimes, and it makes quite a big difference.

**To Birmingham:** Several members of our Building Plans Committee are going to Birmingham the last of this week to check on the work being done by our architect. According to the best information that we have now the plans are scheduled for delivery August 23.

**Mission School:** At this writing it looks as if there is nothing to do but cancel plans for a Vacation Bible School at the New Warrington Road Mission. Next week seems to be the last possible week that the school can be held and the building will not be sufficiently completed to permit its use. If a way can be found to overcome the obstacles, we'll move right ahead. Paul sometimes found doors closed, but, when he did, the Lord always opened others. Christians don't quit in the face of difficulties, they just find the will of the Lord and go on.

**Another Deacon Emeritus:** At the business meeting on Wednesday night our church adopted a report from the Deacons and made Brother Pope Shank a deacon emeritus of our church. We are grateful for his past service and are happy that in the new capacity he will continue to serve the church for life.
