

QUESTIONS YOU MAY BE ASKING

1. What if I should move away during 1955, or should become unable to meet my obligation?

Signing a Covenant Card simply expresses our intention, God making it possible, for 1955. Of course, circumstances may arise that make impossible the fulfillment of one's pledge. Remember, in your church no "dun" is sent asking one for the "balance" of one's pledge. Only a quarterly report is sent each contributor telling him what he has given, so he may have a record for tax purposes, or for his own records. Your pledge is entirely between you and God. A phone call to the office can cancel the balance at any time, or, if nothing is done, it still is not recorded against one's record. **Your pledge simply expresses your faith in 1955, and in God's help to make possible its fulfillment.**

2. With the economy moves of the government, the continuation of my job is uncertain. What if I am terminated in 1955?

Again, we need to remind ourselves that a pledge is simply a declaration of one's purpose for 1955, if God continues to make it possible. Do you not think that there is more possibility of keeping one's job, or securing another job, if we take God as our partner in 1955? Go on and sign your covenant card for 1955 and leave these matters of vital and anxious concern in the hands of the God we trust.

3. What if I feel that I cannot give anything in 1955 but the tithe. Should I give it all through the "Budget Envelope" and ignore the "Building Fund Envelope" from week to week?

Surely, all of us wish to participate in both sides of the financial program of our church. Even if one can only give the humblest amount above the tithe in the Building Fund Envelope, the thrill of making a LOVE GIFT above the tithe will bring great joy.

Remember, however, that our regular budget includes \$52,000.00 for the Building Fund. Your pledge of your tithe through the regular budget enables you to have a part in our Building Program.

4. If I pledge a love gift, in faith, above my tithe, do you believe God will help make it possible for me to make that gift?

I certainly do! He may bring into our hands extra money we had not planned on, or He might make it possible for the remainder of our money to go further in our daily expenditures. This is where faith comes in. To go beyond the tithe, for many of our people, is a daring enterprise with God.

5. If there are just one or two wage earners in the family, but each person contributes from that income, how do you count the tithers?

If your children give part of your tithe, they are contributing tithed money, and are eligible to check the tither's box on the covenant card. After they become juniors, they should check or fail to check in accordance with their own convictions and their willingness to tithe their own allowance, or the money that comes their way.—Adapted.


