



# Viewpoint

**Wallace Rogers Speaks**—I was quite impressed with what Dr. Rogers had to say to The Citadel Square Church in the **Citadel Square News**, November 28. It read in part as follows:

"A frank word from your pastor needs to be spoken just here about our Every Member Canvass. God's standard is the tithe. The tithe brought in to the storehouse is the only scriptural method I know. That does not mean dividing the tithe with your favorite charity, the community chest, some needy relative. The storehouse is God's House, your church. The adopted budget voted by the church is the authorized manner of spending that money. Every member of the church can enter into this commanding program for our Lord. I am anxious that each one of us have his or her own sense of personal responsibility and that the pledge be made on that basis.

"Pray that God may lead each of us as we make the pledge which will be the measure of our devotion to the cause of Christ—read that again, for I want you to know that I did not say the amount was the measure. I said the pledge is the measure for the pledge you make will be determined by two things—your spirit of devotion and your ability to give. Personally, I want to be a tither. I hope you do. God bless you as you face this grave question in your Christian life."




