## LOCKING OF BUILDINGS

At the Business Meeting of the church last Wednesday evening, the church adopted the following recommendation brought by the Board of Deacons:

"Due to the location of our church, with ready access to all who pass by, we feel that it will be to our definite advantage to lock all of the buildings. It is suggested that the buildings be locked beginning Sunday night, December 12, 1954. The procedure for using the church facilities after normal working hours of the church staff will be as follows:

1. All requests for use of the buildings must be cleared through the church office in order to have the building unlocked and avoid conflicts with other groups.
2. Persons requesting use of the building shall be responsible for: Protection of property, turning off gas, lights, and locking the building.
3. Keys will be issued to: Sunday School Superintendent, Training Union Director, Treasurer, Chairman Building Committee, Chairman Deacons, and Church Staff.
4. All keys are to be returned upon request, and no duplicate keys shall be made."

This action is not to limit the use of our building, but will assure the protection of our property.

Organizations and groups in our church will clear with the church office and arrange for place of meeting. Outside groups will get permission to use building and equipment from the Building and Grounds Committee.
