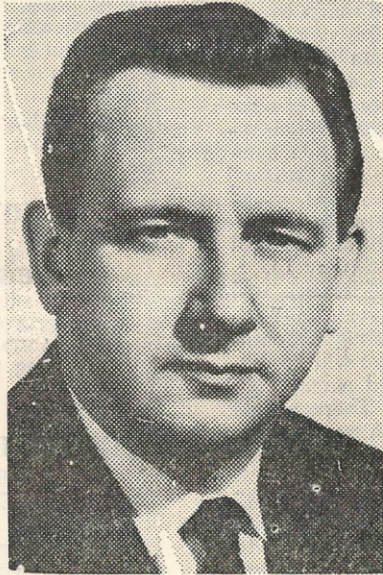

**Radio**—Our Radio Committee, Judson Gillespie, Chairman, has been able to work out plans with Radio Station WPFA, 790 on your radio dial, so that our Sunday morning services can be broadcast from 11:00 to 12:00 each Sunday. As the bulletin goes to press it appears that everything is arranged for the broadcasts to begin on Sunday, February 13. Be certain to pass this information along to your friends, especially our sick and shut-in members. In the event of any unexpected delay in completing the necessary technical connections, it is definite that we will be on the air by February 20th. This additional ministry of our church is going to be cared for financially by your faithfulness in supporting the regular church budget with your offerings.

**Rain**—Already we have had rough weather for at least three Sundays this year. With more than nine inches of rain falling last week-end, it was not hard to imagine something of how Noah must have felt. In the light of the weather, I was proud of our attendance at all services. The weather moved out of the "excuse" into the "reason" class last Sunday.

**Business**—Several matters of business will be brought to the congregation at a Business Meeting next Wednesday night, February 16. Among other things we will be asked to remove several hundred names from our church roll by erasure. These people have not been heard from in years and a careful check has revealed no information about them. Our Membership Committee is conducting a thorough search for our "lost" members.

**Stetson**—Our deacons are leading us to take a worthy place in the current Stetson Campaign. During the Christmas holidays the School lost its facilities for serving meals. On Easter Sunday our church will join others of the state in making a worthy offering. We ought to contribute at least \$2,000 for this purpose.

**Prayer**—Continue to pray for our revival, March 6-13. Special Community Prayer Services will be held February 21 and 25, with our Young People directing a prayer period at the church on February 26th.

Due to the bad weather last Sunday, we were not able to take the Census in the Navy Point area. Our plans are to complete this task on next Sunday. We will have lunch at the church immediately following the 11:00 Service and will go out from here. We are counting on all of those who had planned to help on last Sunday. Please let us know if you can help.

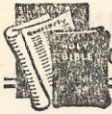
