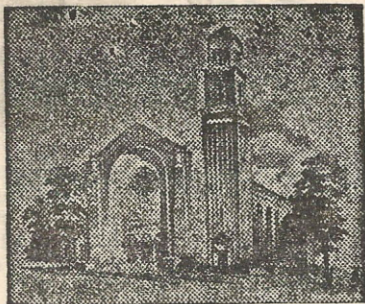
## The Reverie Of A Downtown Church

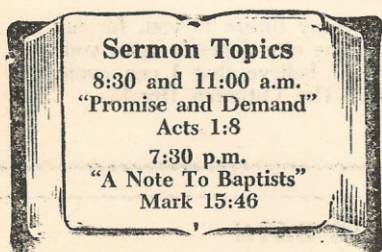

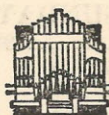
