From Asuncion, Paraguay, has come the announcement that the Stanley Davis Memorial Fund will be used to equip a laboratory in the new nursing school which is to be built there.

Stanley Walker described the drought conditions in Texas in an article in the New York Herald Tribune, January 13, 1957. He said in part: "It was the year the windmills pumped air, the fish died in the dusty ponds, the jackrabbits nibbled prickly pear, the baby quail fell into the cracks in the earth, the termites ate the onions, the bankers forgot how to laugh, and the rattlesnakes crawled into the living room." He also added; "And yet all confidence is not lost." I would add: God took care of Joseph and of Jacob's family when there was famine in Egypt. I also seem to remember something about Elijah and some dry weather. It's about time we learned to look to God for some of the answers. Of course, the dangerous thing about that is He might send us to build storehouses or to face the priests of Baal. Better not ask God for answers unless you are willing for Him to make you a part of the answer.
