Viewpoint

Pew Captains who served during the revival services deserve a special vote of thanks from the pastor and congregation. We appreciate the work that you did.

Community Responsibility—A pastor has the opportunity and responsibility of community leadership beyond the confines of his own membership. Because of this I have attempted to serve as a member of the Baptist Hospital Corporation, as a director of the Mental Health Association, on a committee that is seeking to establish a Family Counseling service in the community, as a member of the Community Council, and as one of the subscribers of the Legal Aid Society. I have tried to make very small financial contributions to the Community Chest, the Y. M. C. A., the Mental Health Association and other community service agencies. I am called upon to do much counseling beyond the membership of our church, especially marriage counseling.

One group that I have been serving as President is the Pensacola Area Association on Community Relations. Its purpose as stated in its By-Laws is: "1. To provide for a constructive approach to the concerns of the community. 2. To achieve an atmosphere characterized by the basic principles of democracy: respect for all human beings, cooperation for the common good of all, intelligent action in all human activities."

I have learned that some erroneous ideas have gotten abroad about the Association. Because of this I am calling your attention to the purpose of the group. I believe that there are many people in our community who would agree that there is a "spirit" in our town that helps to make it a delightful place to live. The Association would like to help enrich this "spirit."

I deplore the divisions and misunderstandings that seem to constantly plague some communities. Major antagonisms, whether between capital and labor, between Jews and Gentiles, between whites and blacks, between the "haves" and the "have-nots", need to be resolved in a common sense manner. Of course, I do not believe that such solutions can be found outside of Christ. It is to lend such assistance as is possible in this area of human relations that I am an active member of the Association on Community Relations.

I believe that you expect your pastor and the First Baptist Church to fulfill their community responsibilities in the name of Christ.
