PASTOR AWARDED HONORARY DEGREE

Our pastor was awarded the honorary degree of Doctor of Divinity by Wake Forest College Monday.

Mr. Brooks was one of five men to receive honorary degrees during the college's first spring commencement on the new campus at Winston-Salem.

The citation read, in part:

"Mr. Nathan C. Brooks, Jr., attended Mars Hill College for two years, then transferred to Wake Forest College, where he received the Bachelor of Arts degree in 1931. For the next three years he was a student at the Southern Baptist Theological Seminary at Louisville. There he was awarded the degree of Master of Theology.

"He is a good organizer, an inspiring director in building programs and in increasing membership. He is an effective preacher and a faithful shepherd who magnifies the ministry."

We are happy that this recognition has come to our pastor.
