1. ENTER HIS COURTS WITH PRAISE. I will go quietly to my pew, recognizing the organ prelude as affording me the opportunity of meditation, cleansing my mind, centering attention, getting in the right spirit.
2. GOD'S HOUSE IS A HOUSE OF PRAYER. I will be seated and consciously bow my head to pray for the service, the preacher, the lost, the tempted, myself, and World Missions.
3. WORSHIP IS THE RESPONSE OF AN INDIVIDUAL HEART TO GOD. Therefore, I will participate in worship, joining in the morning prayer, singing hymns of praise, giving attention to scripture reading, following the words of the anthem, listening attentively to the sermon, praying for decisions at the invitation.
4. OBSERVING GOOD CHURCH MANNERS IS CHRISTLIKE. Others about me will come to worship; therefore, I will not whisper or distract. I will not attempt to move in and be seated among others during the call to worship, prayer, special music, or the reading of the scripture.
5. HEARING THE WORD OF GOD FEEDS THE SOUL. I will be a good listener, following the minister's text and message with a prayerful heart.
6. I AM HOST TO THE VISITOR AND STRANGER. Immediately after the benediction, I will in warm cordiality seek out the visitors with welcome. I will introduce them to others about me as a good host should.

Our Bible Readers' Banquet will be held Friday evening, July 12, at 7:00 p.m.


Those who have read the Daily Bible Reading Course of the Training Union from January 1 to June 30 are eligible to attend.


