Viewpoint

Home is a wonderful place. Leave it and you seem to love it more than ever. Try to forget it and it will not be forgotten. Neglect it and the heart is restless and dissatisfied. Enrich it and you find your feeble efforts rewarded with abundant fruit. Serve it and you discover noble character developing in your own flesh and blood. Honor it and you reap eternal rewards. You ask, "Whence came such thoughts about home?" I'll tell you—I have been away from home and family during my vacation and I find in my experience that it is true that "there is no place like home."

Please Pray for the meeting of the Baptist Bible Institute Trustees as they meet at Graceville, Florida, next Tuesday. They face some very far-reaching decisions.

For the Benefit of those members who could not be with us at the morning service on last Sunday let me point out three things that I feel that we need to magnify in the life of our church: (1) Our emphasis must be upon things spiritual and enduring; (2) We need to understand ourselves better; and (3) We need to love one another more. The first of these suggestions seems rather obvious. Yet, many of us still place the primary emphasis upon things that can be counted and seen. The early church was not so much worried about buildings and externals as it was about life and spirit. When I say that we need to understand ourselves better, I am thinking that many of us do not seem to realize that we are a downtown church in a growing city. We can no longer serve the Lord as though we were a small community church. As for loving one another more—here is the heart of Christian fellowship.

Many People will be asked to accept responsibilities during the next few weeks. This is the time when the Nominating Committee is seeking to man the organizational life of the church for the next year. Bear in mind that there is no one to accept these responsibilities except those of us who are members of the church. Weigh the privilege that we have of joining hands together in Christ's service. Seek God's guidance before making any decision about a responsibility. Think twice before saying, "No". After all the Lord is counting upon us to be faithful, and He will go with us all of the way in any task that we undertake.

Next Wednesday Night at the Prayer Service hour I will speak about **The Man Who Got Mad With God**, Jonah 4:1,4. Read the book of Jonah before you come.

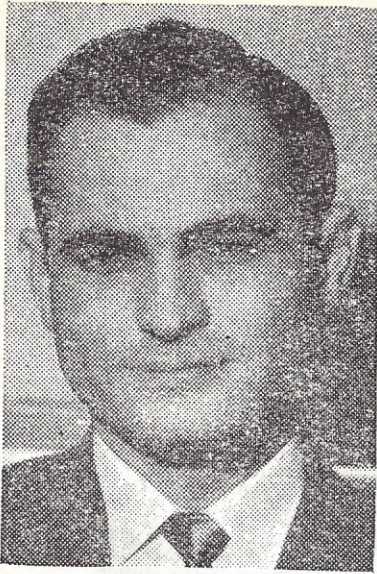
