

Viewpoint

September 3 will mark another milestone in our church life. On that date our church kindergarten will hold its first session. Mrs. Stoesen visited the 22 children who are enrolled on August 6 and 7. On August 13 a meeting of parents will be held at 7:30 p.m. in Junior 12 Department in the Children's Building. Mr. Charles Overman, Jr. and the entire Kindergarten Committee are to be congratulated upon bringing to reality this dream which we have cherished for several years.

Contrast—There is a happy contrast between the headlines in the public press about 'teenage delinquency in New York City and the experiences many of our own young people are having at our Church Camp this week. I hope that the church is aware of the contribution that it is making to young lives through these camping experiences. When you get despondent about some of the things that seem to bear little fruit for the effort expended, just examine our camping program. We continue to reap benefits from what has taken place at camp in other summers. We will be harvesting rich rewards for a long time to come from this year's camps. Thank you, Mr. Bizzell, for a good camping program!

Covetousness can be a very ugly sin in Christian life. I have a feeling that even the Lord might not condemn me for one thing that I covet for our church—a greater missionary spirit. I received a real thrill when I read in the bulletin of the First Baptist Church, Greenville, South Carolina, that their gifts to the mission program of our denomination have passed the \$100,000.00 mark this year. I have not asked the Lord to allow us to surpass the record of the Greenville church in the years ahead. I have asked Him to make us so missionary in outlook that we will do our best—whatever that is—in missionary giving. No church is very serious about Christian discipleship that does not begin to stretch itself in missionary living and giving.

One Thing that is evident about the Billy Graham Crusade in New York is that it is meeting a need that Christians have felt for an opportunity to confess their sins and dedicate themselves to Christ. Our Catholic friends are accustomed to the "confessional". Too often Baptists who err just "go on", trying to follow the forms of Christian life while things are not right on the inside. Jesus denounced such people in his day as "whited sepulchres". Many of those who are responding in the New York Crusade at the invitation period are those who have confessed Christ before. Their response to Mr. Graham's invitation amounts to a "confession" and a turning from sin. After all, Christians constantly need to turn to Jesus for cleansing.

Those words accused my heart as a deacon explained by telephone that a man in our town, for who we had prayed and on whom we planned to call, had just committed suicide.

As I replaced the telephone on my desk, I realized that the deacon was saying in effect, that as far as this man was concerned, dead by his own hand, our highly efficient organization had bogged down. The \$100,000 educational plant was hollow mockery and our assets of hundreds of church members were liabilities.

That very day that man's wife was won to Christ. She was baptized into our church fellowship shortly after her husband's tragic death. But for him, we had waited too late.

Evangelism is urgent business. We must lead men to God with the skill of a surgeon, the finesse of an artist, the energy of an athlete, the tactful persistence of a good salesman, and the compassion of a Christ who gave his life that all men might be saved.—Copied.
