# Viewpoint

**Baptist Business** is big business in the State of Florida. I was in Jacksonville for three days for the meeting of our State Board of Missions. That group decided to recommend an administrative and operating budget for next year of \$1,800,000. If adopted by the State Convention in November, one-half of that will go for Southern Baptist Convention causes and one-half for Florida causes.

The Recommendations call for Florida Baptist Children's Home to receive \$110,000; Stetson University, \$157,200; Ministerial Education at Stetson, \$23,580; Baptist Bible Institute, \$23,580; and Field Missions, \$471,600.

**Increased Living Costs** today were reflected in a recommendation to grant salary increases to all Convention employees.

**Additional Plans** were made for Capital Fund Gifts for Stetson, the Children's Home, Baptist Bible Institute, and the New Work Revolving Fund of the Convention. Endorsement was given to a plan for the Stetson Trustees to launch a special program for gifts for the school.

**All of This** simply means that Florida Baptists, who have been so abundantly blessed by the Lord, need to be more faithful to their opportunities in a dedication to great Christian stewardship.

**My Next Denominational Responsibility** has to do with Carver School. I am spending two days in Louisville, Ky., this week for a committee meeting. Then the regular Carver Trustees Meeting will come up in October.

**Next Week** I am assisting in Revival Services at the Northside Baptist Church, Jackson, Mississippi. Brother William Carr, our District Field Secretary, will fill the pulpit on September 22.
