First Baptist members are invited to visit North Hill and take part in this service of organization. Nathan C. Brooks, Jr., the First Baptist Pastor, will bring the message.

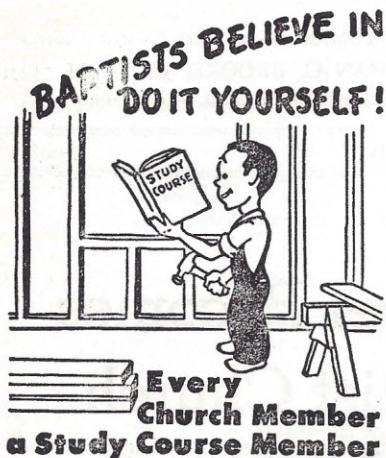

IN THE WORLD OF RELIGION

... The longest and perhaps most successful evangelistic crusade of modern times ended September 1 when Billy Graham brought his sixteen-week campaign to a close. Total attendance exceeded 2 million, with 56,767 "decisions for Christ." Three other great evangelists of history, Charles G. Finney, Dwight L. Moody, and Billy Sunday, appearing at approximately forty-year intervals conducted successful campaigns in New York City. John A. Mackay, president, Princeton Theological Seminary, lauded Graham's effort with the statement, "This thing has been of God . . . Graham's ministry has been prophetic. Men have been made aware of the sins of the heart and society."
