## Dr. Batson Chosen to Lead Church in Budget Pledging

On Wednesday Night, the Church elected Dr. P. G. Batson to lead this church in cooperating with the Southern Baptist Forward Program of Church Finance.

For 29 days, from October 27 to November 24, Dr. Batson will lead us in a stewardship emphasis and the pledging of our 1958 Budget.

Commenting on the experience of the Parkway Church, Jackson, Mississippi, in using the Forward Program of Church Finance last year in a denomination-sponsored test of the procedures, Dr. G. Norman Price, Pastor, said, "Doubling our gifts through the Cooperative Program was our greatest thrill."

Comparing 1955 and 1956 in the First Baptist Church, Jackson, Mississippi, Dr. W. D. Hudgins, Pastor, stated, "Last year we got pledges from 1,420 of our members. This year 2,250 members made pledges. Last year's budget was \$271,500, and we set a rather challenging goal of \$401,000 for this campaign. We reached 93 per cent of our goal."

**Our Gratitude Needs Practical Expression** in a better stewardship of material things. At the end of September, our contributions lacked \$5,065.29 of taking care of all of the outstanding current obligations of our church.

The Answer is not to be found in curtailing the program and work of the church in the name of Christ. The right answer is to be found in a better stewardship of our material things. So far as the financial records of our church are concerned there are 831 members who have not made a recorded gift this year. 322 of these live right here in Pensacola.

I Can't Believe that there are 322 of us who have had no blessings from God. I can't believe that there are 322 of us who are satisfied to do nothing for the work of the Lord.

Our Records show that 475 of us have committed ourselves to tithe. The pastor and the members of his family are in this group. You expect that of us. The really important thing is what the Lord is expecting of all of us. If you are not tithing your income, are you satisfied that you are doing all that the Lord expects? The answer is between each of us and God, himself.

This Is The Time to do our best, not the little thing, in the name of Christ.

The Forward Program of Church Finance will challenge us to undertake more during 1958. We need to move forward NOW in our Stewardship.

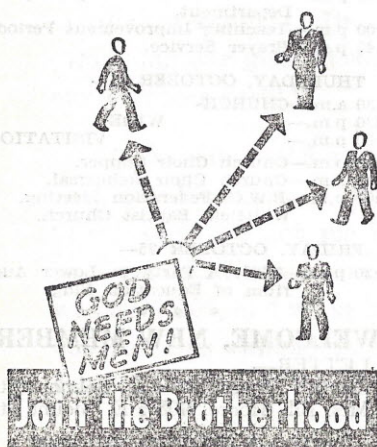
