CHURCH REACHES TOWARD VICTORY

The spirit of the members of the First Baptist Church has been most encouraging during the past few days. Eighty-three men met Monday night for Canvass assignments in connection with the Forward Program. As of 7 p.m. Wednesday, 1154 pledges had been received, with 560 of these indicating that they would tithe. The pledges of this group, plus the estimated loose offerings during 1958, amount to \$176,278.28.

Approximately \$8,000.00 additional had been pledged by the same people as special gifts to Building Debt Retirement.

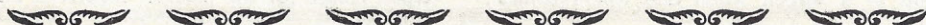
This represents (at present) a substantial advance in pledging over last year, and there are at least 300 more homes to be contacted. Surely every member and every family in the church will want to pray for and work toward reaching (as a minimum) our 1958 Budget goal of \$225,000.
