Chaplain John B. Cheshire, Jr. has asked that I call to your attention the new system for visitors at Baptist Hospital. Let me quote from his letter:

"The amount of visitors at Baptist Hospital has become so acute in the recent past that some system of control has become imperative. The Medical Staff, Administration and Nursing Department feel that the following system should be put into effect. It will not only give the doctors and nurses adequate room to take care of the patient, but it will also be better for the patient. Your cooperation in helping the hospital to enforce the rules and regulations will be appreciated.

Visiting Hours: 10:30 - 11:00 a.m.
2:00 - 4:00 p.m.
7:00 - 8:30 p.m.

"Each patient will have two visitor cards. Each visitor is requested to stop at the information desk in the lobby and get a card. If the patient has two visitors already, the visitors will be asked to wait in the lobby until the cards are returned to the information desk by the visitors already visiting the patient. When these cards or a card is returned, another visitor may go up to see the patient.

"NO PATIENT MAY HAVE MORE THAN TWO VISITORS AT THE BED-SIDE AT ONE TIME. PLEASE RETURN THE VISITOR CARD TO THE INFORMATION DESK."
