Church Adds Elementary Worker

Following joint recommendations from the Kindergarten, Personnel, and Finance Committees, with concurrence of the Chairman of the Children's Work Committee, the Deacons recommended to the church Wednesday night that Miss Evelyn Heintz be added to the staff as Kindergarten Principal and Elementary Director.

Miss Heintz, who graduated from the New Orleans Seminary last week, visited our church a few weeks ago. She received her B.S. degree from Colorado A. and M. College and has done graduate work in dietetics at the University of Indiana. For several years she served as a dietician in Veteran's Administration hospitals.

Formerly a Presbyterian, Miss Heintz became a Baptist by conviction and choice. While attending the New Orleans Seminary she has served as dietician for the Sellers Baptist Home and Adoption Center and as Beginner Co-ordinator at the First Baptist Church, New Orleans.

Mr. H. C. (Bill) Lowry, Educational Director of the First Baptist Church, New Orleans, has written concerning Miss Heintz: "She is consecrated, diligent and capable. You would have to search long and hard to find anyone more capable than she. . . . She has exceptional ability to communicate her ideas to her fellow workers. Children also respond to her leadership in a very notable way. Indeed if we were ready to consider a full time Elementary Worker at the present time we would certainly consider her for our position."

PASTOR ELECTED CARVER PRESIDENT

In a telephone conversation with the Chairman of the Deacons, J.
