



CARVER SCHOOL

Carver School of Missions and Social Work

2801 Lexington Road — Louisville, Kentucky



So that our people may know a little more about the work of Carver School we present this information:

- 1904—Women of Louisville established a home for women who were attending certain classes at Southern Seminary.
- 1907—Woman's Missionary Union adopted the project, making it a Training School for Christian Workers.
- 1953—The School became co-educational and was renamed Carver School in honor of Dr. W. O. Carver, a distinguished Southern Baptist Missionary Statesman and Teacher.
- 1957—The Southern Baptist Convention accepted ownership of the School at its Chicago Convention in June, naming 30 Trustees to operate the School. Your pastor was one of those asked to serve.
- May 20, 1958—Your pastor was elected President of Carver School of Missions and Social Work.

What Is The Purpose of the School?

According to its charter: "to provide and maintain a school of the highest spiritual and educational standards for the training of personnel in church social work and specialized missionary service for the propagation of the Christian faith."

What Is Its Relationship To Southern Seminary?

They are separate schools, both belonging to the Southern Baptist Convention. They happen to operate on adjoining campuses.

Is Carver School Different From the Seminaries?

Yes! It seeks to prepare specialized workers for service in Good Will Centers, Children's Homes, Homes for the Aging, Hospitals, Rescue Missions, Church-related Social Work, and Home and Foreign Missions. Its training is for a service ministry, rather than for preaching.

Is It A Large School?


No. It is primarily a Graduate School, intended for those who have already completed at least their College work. A small number of students may be admitted who have completed at least 60 hours of college work. These may work toward a B.S. degree. During the 1957-58 School Year and the 1957 Summer Session a total of 115 different persons were enrolled in the School. It is estimated that there will be 150 students by 1963, 200 by 1970.

How Is The School Financed?

Through the Southern Baptist Cooperative Program. Special gifts and scholarships have come from individuals.

What Can We Do For The School?

Pray for the school, its Trustees, President and Faculty! Support the Cooperative Program of Southern Baptists! Recommend those students who feel called of God to those areas of service for which Carver trains.
