Dr. Larry Mayo To Preach Sunday

Dr. J. Larry Mayo, well known to members of our congregation, will preach at both services on Sunday.

Dr. Mayo is a native Pensacolian and is the son of Deacon J. L. Mayo. He is a graduate of the University of Florida and of the Southern Baptist Theological Seminary, Louisville, Kentucky. Dr. and Mrs. Mayo have three children.

For a little more than six years he has served as pastor of the First Baptist Church, Smithfield, North Carolina. He serves as a member of the Board of Trustees of the Relief and Annuity Board of the Southern Baptist Convention.

In the summer of 1955, he attended the Baptist World Alliance Meeting and made a tour of the Holy Land.

Dr. Mayo has preached in our church each summer for several summers, and we look forward to having him with us on Sunday.

Make Your Supper Reservation Sunday

KITCHEN OPERATION

The operation of our church kitchen is a very vital part of the overall program of our church. The serving of meals is a convenience to enable the various organizations to have their meetings in the most effective way. We believe that the fellowship around the tables also makes a contribution.

To help us do all of this in the best possible way the church named a Kitchen Committee. This committee has been working now for several months. We believe that members of our church should pay enough for meals to cover the cost of food. A slight increase has already been made in the cost of meals served to adults.

One of the real problems involved is knowing how many people to prepare for. For a long time we have been asking that reservations be made. For the regular Wednesday meals, many of our people have made PERMANENT RESERVATIONS. For many months we have had from 30 to 60 persons each Wednesday fail to show up. Food for this many people had been prepared.

The following procedure is now being used:

(1) If a person does not show up on Wednesday night his reservation is pulled from the PERMANENT RESERVATION file.

(2) A card is sent asking that he call the church office to renew his reservation.

Any member is welcome to come to the Wednesday night supper. All you need to do is to call in a reservation. This should be done by 9:00 a.m. Wednesday so that the food may be purchased accordingly. However, if you find later in the day that you can come, come on. Those who come without reservations will be asked to wait until those who have reservations have been served. There will always be food which can be prepared quickly.

All of the above is to help us do a better job and to avoid the waste of food.
