



## **BAPTIST BIBLE INSTITUTE PRESIDENT TO PREACH SUNDAY**

Dr. James E. Southerland is to be our guest preacher for both services on Sunday.

Dr. Southerland was born in Wauchula, Florida. Both he and Mrs. Southerland are graduates of Stetson University. Dr. Southerland has his Th.M. Degree from the Southern Baptist Theological Seminary in Louisville, Kentucky, and his Th.D. Degree from the New Orleans Theological Seminary. He has studied at the University of Mississippi and at the University of Edinburgh, Scotland. Dr. Southerland has served the following pastorates: First Baptist

Church, Titusville, Florida; Avondale Baptist Church, Jacksonville, Florida, and First Baptist Church, Oxford, Mississippi.

He served three years in the Air Force Chaplaincy. He served as Registrar and Teacher of Homiletics in the New Orleans Seminary.

On December 1, 1957, he began his work as the President of Baptist Bible Institute. Baptist Bible Institute is owned and operated by the Florida Baptist Convention, having come into the family of Baptists a year ago last June. The primary purpose of the Institute is to train men who have been called into the ministry, who have not had the advantage of a college education. The School has three departments: Theology, Religious Education, and Music. Last year, their enrolment was 108, and they expect at least 150 students this Fall. Dr. Southerland will be formally inaugurated on Thursday, September 18.

We look forward to having Dr. Southerland with us and to have this opportunity of getting to know more about the work of Baptist Bible Institute. You will want to hear him Sunday.

Your child can begin appreciating the church service when he is four years old and some children may enjoy it even earlier. You may ask, "What can a child that age gain from a preaching service?" Some of the advantages your child will gain are to sense something big, and worthwhile, to have a feeling of somebody so great and powerful that people think and talk to Him. He absorbs easily certain beliefs and concepts from both the things he hears and feels as he sits with mother and father in the church service. Even though he does not understand much of the service he gets a sense of well being from the music, prayer and worship of those who meet together. As he sits with mother and father in the church where people talk about God he associates his mother and father with the thought of God and feel they have a relationship with God. It means something to him to hear his pastor read from the Bible and helps him to feel that the pastor is his helper too. He enjoys the stained glass windows and likes to see his friends and neighbors in church.


