HELPS FOR PARENTS

Parents you may find these suggestions helpful when you take your small child to the preaching service. Always sit where your child can see and where he will not feel "fenced in". This will give the child some movement which he needs and he will not get so tired. Come to the church during the week and talk about coming to the church. Make it an experience to be looked forward to with pleasure. Ask him to listen for familiar Bible verses when the pastor reads from the Bible. Help your child to know that we talk before and after the service and not during the service. No greater blessing do you have as a parent than to bring your child up in the love and nurture of the Lord.

PROCEDURE FOR NOMINATING DEACONS

The Committee for the Nomination of Deacons requests that every member of the church suggest men who should be considered for nomination as deacons. You may nominate as many men as you think qualify.

These suggestions must reach the Committee by Noon, Wednesday, September 10. They may be given to any member of the Committee, mailed to the Church Office in care of the Committee, or dropped in the offering plate. The Nomination Form must be signed to be counted.

Your Committee, selected for the purpose of recommending to the church the best qualified persons, wishes to submit the following Scripture passages for your guidance, and in turn requests that you offer the names of as many men as you believe to be qualified to serve as deacons:

SELECTION OF THE FIRST DEACONS:

"Now in these days, when the number of the disciples was multiplying, there arose a murmuring of the Grecian Jews against the Hebrews, because their widows were neglected in the daily ministration. And the twelve called the multitude of the disciples unto them, and said, It is not fit that we should forsake the word of God, and serve tables. Look ye out therefore, brethren, from among you seven men of good report, full of the Spirit and of wisdom, whom we may appoint over this business. But we will continue steadfastly in prayer, and in the ministry of the word,"—(Acts 6:1-4)

THE CHARACTER AND QUALIFICATIONS OF ALL DEACONS

"Deacons in like manner **must be** grave, not double-tongued, not given to much wine, not greedy of filthy lucre; holding the mystery of the faith in a pure conscience. And let these also first be proved; then let them serve as deacons, if they be blameless. Women in like manner **must be** grave, not slanderers, temperate, faithful in all things. Let deacons be husbands of one wife, ruling **their** children and their own houses well. For they that have served well as deacons gain to themselves a good standing, and great boldness in the faith which is in Christ Jesus."—(I Timothy 3:8-13).

We urge you to be much in prayer that we as a church may know God's will in this all-important task of making these nominations.

The ballot will be on September 21 when ten men will be elected to serve as deacons for the three year term beginning October 1, 1958.


