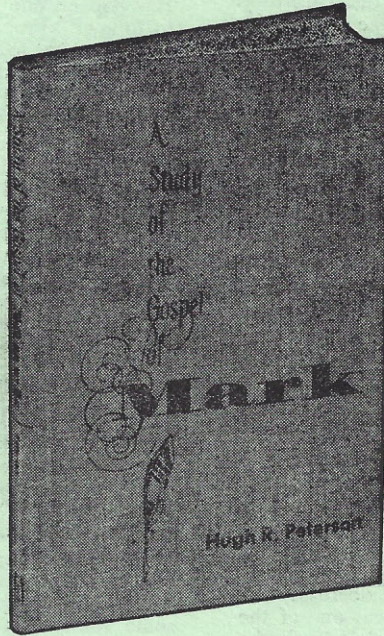

**9:30 - 11:30 a.m.—Mr. Bizzell teaching**

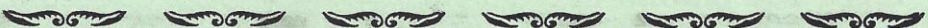
Because of WMS Circle Meetings on Tuesday morning, there will not be a Tuesday morning class.

## VISIT EVERY HOME

Mr. Charles Overman, our Superintendent of Enlargement, is leading our Sunday School officers and teachers to make a personal visit into the home of every member of our Sunday School. A large graph showing the percentage of the task completed was displayed on Wednesday evening. The following questions and answers will give many details of this effort:

### QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

**Q. Who is responsible for making the weekly report?**

A. For the department, the Associate Superintendent. For the Class, the teacher.

**Q. Who is to make the visits?**

A. For the department, the Department Superintendent is to visit in the home of each of his department officers. For the Class, the Teacher. If it is impracticable for the teacher to make the visits a visitation committee shall make them and report to the teacher.

**Q. What does total number on roll indicate?**

A. This is the total on the roll including the teacher. A visit to the home of the teacher by a group of class members will count as a visited home.

**Q. What constitutes the number of homes visited to date?**

A. Each member's home visited since promotion day shall count as one home visited. If two or more members of the class or department live in the same home, the total number of visits may equal the number living there.

**Q. Does each of several visits to the same home count?**

A. No. Only the first visit counts, however the more the visits, the better the class.

**Q. Why is it important to make the visits in the home?**

A. Briefly the main reason for making the visits in each home is so that the teacher may more fully understand the needs of those to whom he brings God's Word each Sunday morning.



*Library Notes*

Do you have the idea, which is not so rare, that a church library is made up of old worn-out books that people donated because they didn't want them any more? I used to think that; and I'm afraid I was right, as far as some church libraries are concerned. But that is not true of ours. There is an item of five hundred dollars in our annual church budget for the library; by far the greatest part of this amount goes for new books, good books, worthwhile books, up-to-date books. They are there for you to use, and you are passing up hundreds of dollars worth of good reading each year if you don't take advantage of it. Can you afford a loss like that?
