THIS SUMMER FOR THE SAVIOR

Our pastor has challenged us to make this summer the best summer ever in the life of the First Baptist Church.

The highest average attendance for the Sunday School during the summer months was in 1953 when we averaged 965. The Sunday School has adopted as the goal for this summer 1038.

The other activities planned by the Sunday School for the summer include the promotion of the Operation Home Study which proved so helpful last summer, and the enrolment of one new Sunday School pupil for each worker in the Sunday School. (This will mean an increase of 280 in the Sunday School enrolment).

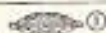
