BIBLE SURVEY PLAN TO BE OFFERED

PURPOSE:

To give Sunday School workers, prospective workers, and other interested persons an intensive survey of the entire Bible.

SCHEDULE:

The plan is for the class to meet for two hours one night each week for thirty (30) weeks. The night will be either Tuesday or Thursday, depending upon the wishes of the group. Also, if there are enough interested, it will be offered on Thursday mornings.

MATERIAL:

The first unit of study is primarily a rapid survey of the entire Bible. The next five units of study are based primarily on leading characters in the Bible. Each member of the class will be encouraged to read the entire Bible during the course.

ENROLL NOW:

In order that we might know how to plan, we are asking those interested to enroll now. Sunday will be Enrollment Day. If additional information is needed, please contact Mr. Bizzell, who will be the teacher.

As we come to the close of our church year, I would like to say "Thank You" to each of you for the kind remarks, letters and telephone calls. It has been a joy to work with you. To each officer and circle chairman, it has been a privilege and a blessing to have the opportunity of working with you this year in the interest of missions.


