BIBLE SURVEY PLAN TO BE OFFERED

The response to Bible Survey Plan has been much more than we had anticipated.

Following the preference indicated by the largest number of our people, the Bible Survey Plan will be offered on Tuesday nights, beginning on October 6 (7:00-9:00 p.m.)

In addition to the Tuesday night classes, the Bible Survey Plan will be held on Thursday mornings (9:30-11:30 a.m.), beginning on October 8.

We are asking those who indicated a Thursday night preference to let us know if they plan to attend the Tuesday night sessions.

Some have asked about the cost of the materials to be used. The textbooks will be 75c each (there are six of these). The Supplementary Study Helps are 90c each (only one set is needed for the entire course). We will let you know as soon as these materials are in.
