BIBLE SURVEY RESUMES NEXT WEEK

The Bible Survey course will resume with sessions next week. We will begin our study of the third book in the Bible Survey Plan. This book is entitled "From Joshua to David" and was written by Dr. John L. Hill. Any person can study any one of the books and receive credit in The Church Study Course for Teaching and Training. The night class meets from 7:00 to 9:00 on Tuesday evenings. The morning class meets from 9:30 to 11:30 on Thursday mornings.

As a part of the Bible Survey sessions for the next three weeks, we shall be using a series of dramatic documentary films entitled "Our Bible — How It Came to Us." These films produced by the American Bible Society cover 20 centuries of the history of our Bible.
