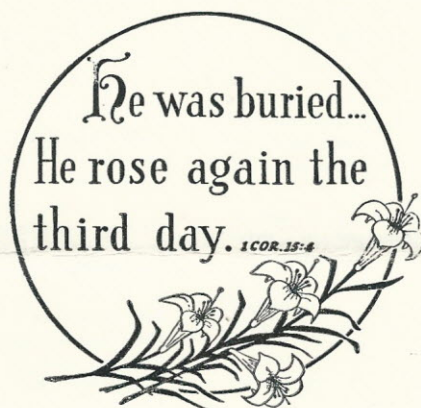

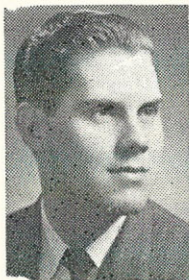


He Is Risen

NEW BABY NURSERY

If you want to check on your baby between Sunday school and church, please knock on the nursery door and the worker will be glad to come and tell you how your baby is getting along. If you open the door and come in and several more parents do the same, it is upsetting to the babies and perhaps they were very happy until you made your entrance, but now several are unhappy.

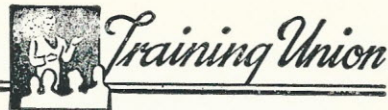
All of our babies will have a happier experience if you will help us with these things.
