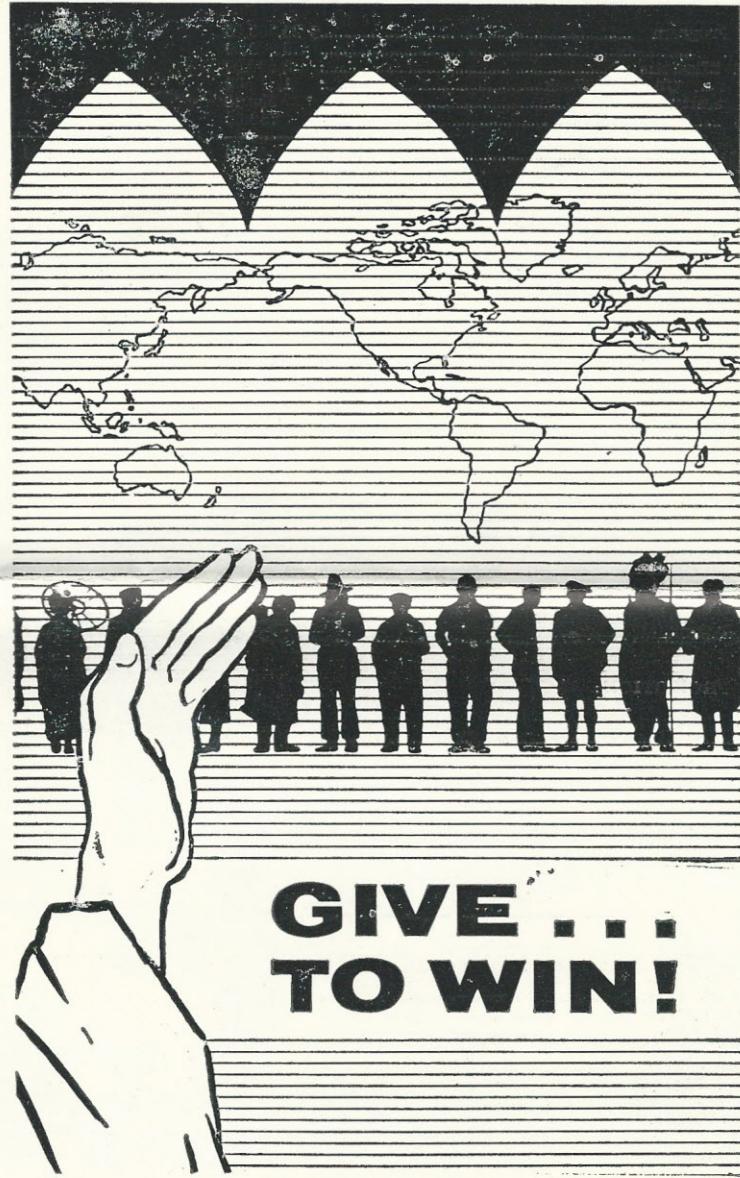

SUNDAY LAUNCHES 1961 STEWARDSHIP EFFORT FOR F. B. C.

BUDGET PROMOTION STARTS CAMPAIGN

Sunday marks the beginning of a twenty-nine day emphasis on Stewardship with the general theme "Give To Win!"

During this period, we will be thinking of the marvelous spiritual victories that can be won through our gift of time and love and talent and money. New blessings await us when we consecrate ourselves and our money to the Lord's work.

The first step will be to adopt a budget goal for 1961. The Proposed 1961 Budget will be presented to the congregation at the morning service this Sunday.

The Budget Planning Committee, J. Nixon Daniel, Chairman, has spent a great deal of time in preparing this proposed budget. It has been presented to the Finance Committee and to the deacons; and, these groups join with the Budget Planning Committee in recommending this budget for 1961. The budget was presented to the congregation on Wednesday evening. Ample time was given for questions, comments, and discussion. On Sunday morning we will be called upon to vote without discussion.

For a number of years now, our members have been making possible an enlarged program of work through increased giving. More members have been giving regularly and many of them have upped their giving to the tithe or more. This table shows a definite pattern of growth over the past four years:
